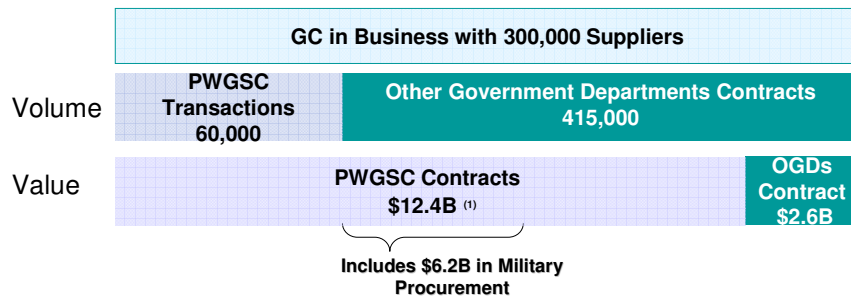
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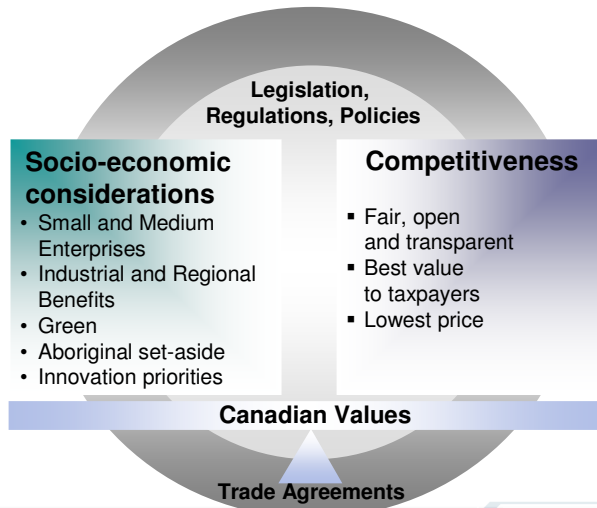

“Fixing procurement will be a top priority. Simpler and streamlined processes will make it easier for businesses to provide products and services to the government and will deliver better results for Canadians.”

Stakeholder views
opportunities for improvement

Suppliers' views:

- Hard to do business with Government of Canada
- Processes are too complex/bureaucratic
- Perceived unfairness/restricted access
- Government is too risk averse

Departments' views:

- Would like more e-tools/easy-to-use/self-serve
- Processes are too complex
- Departments seeking flexibility/better balance with respect to risk



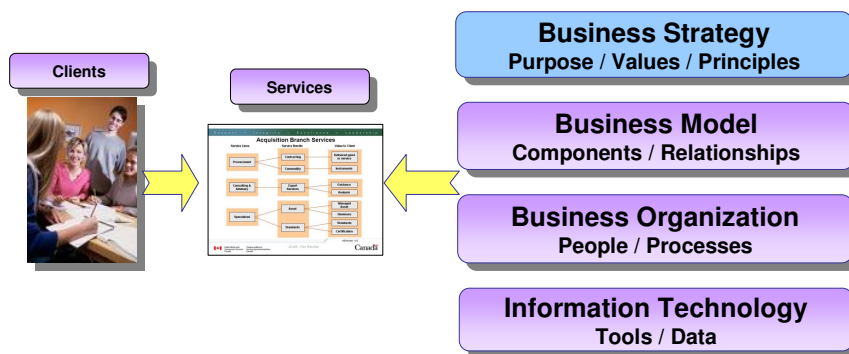

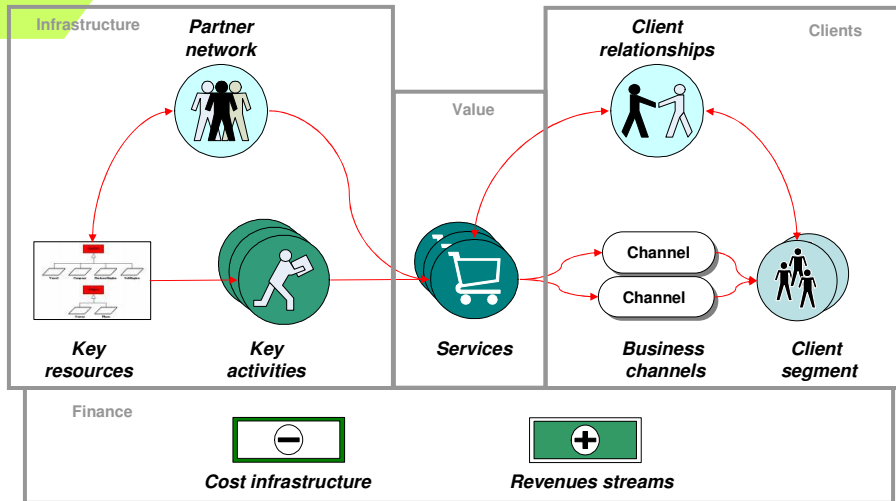

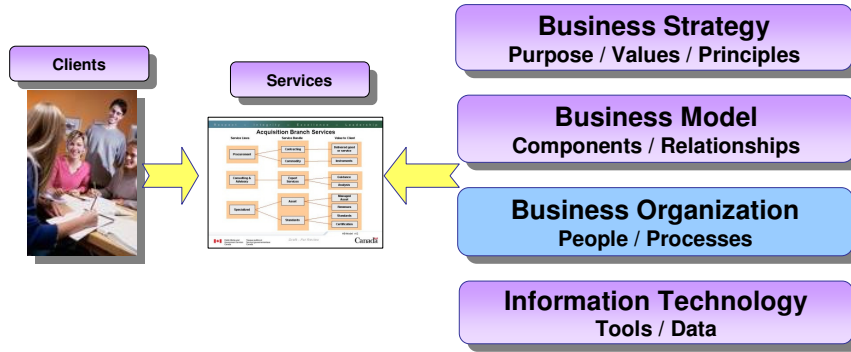

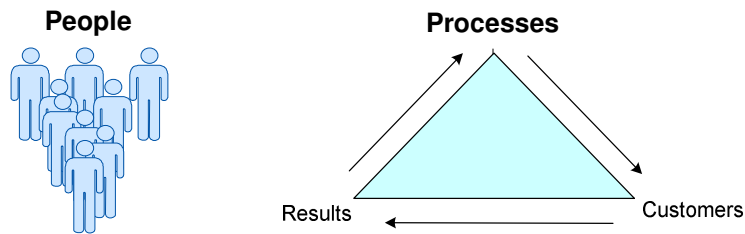
Business Model Components

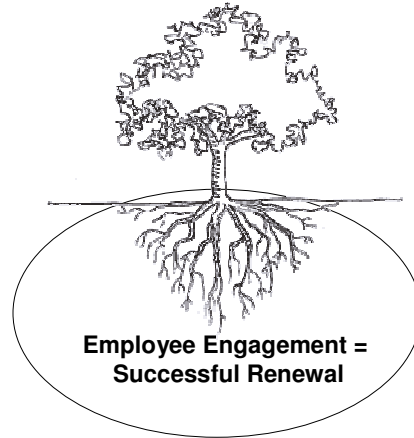

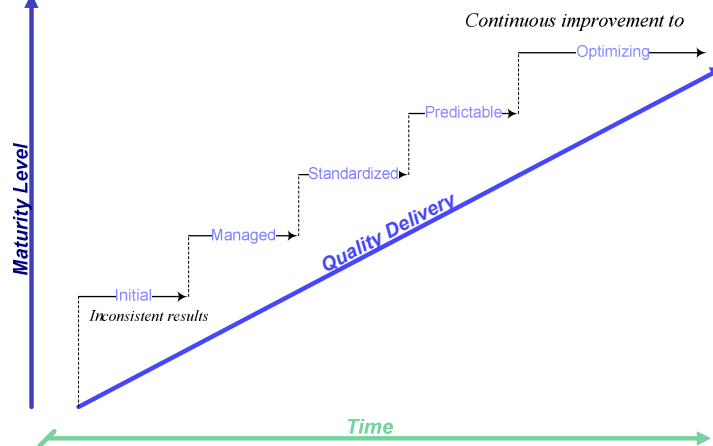

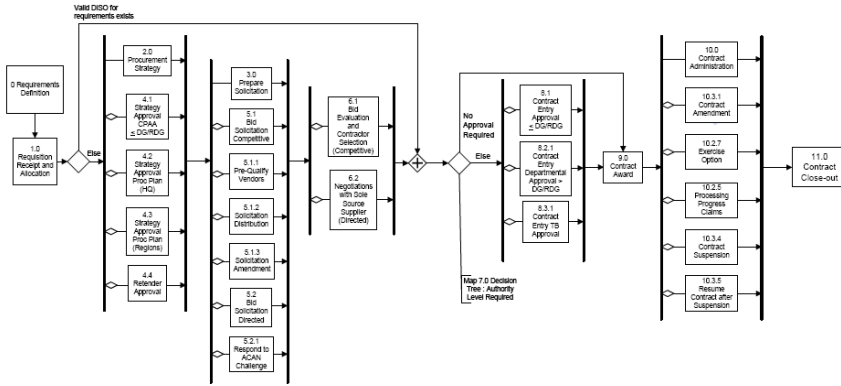

Business Process Management Conceptual Framework

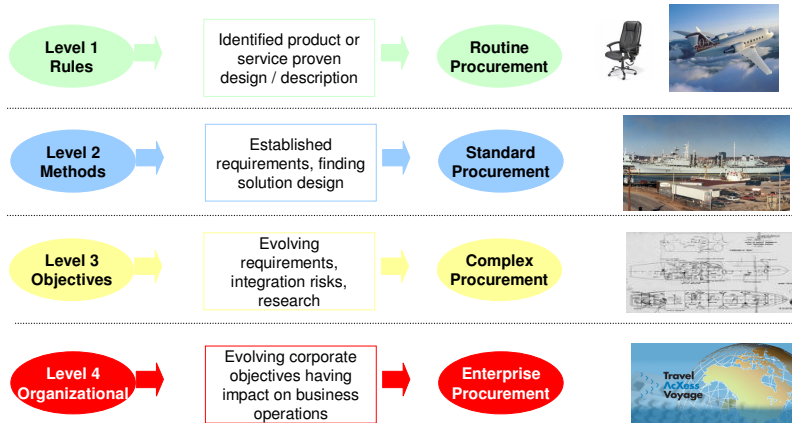

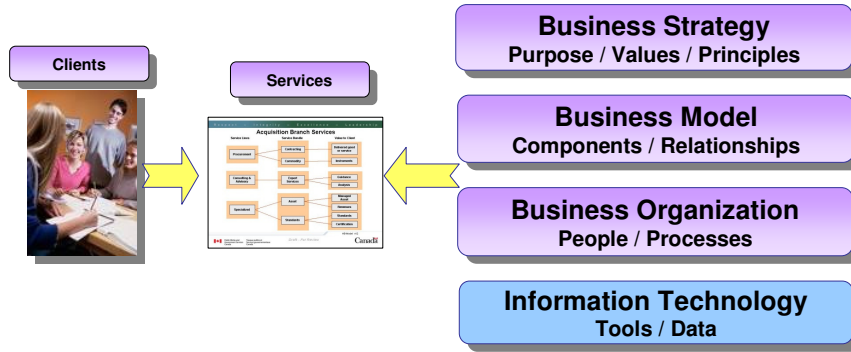

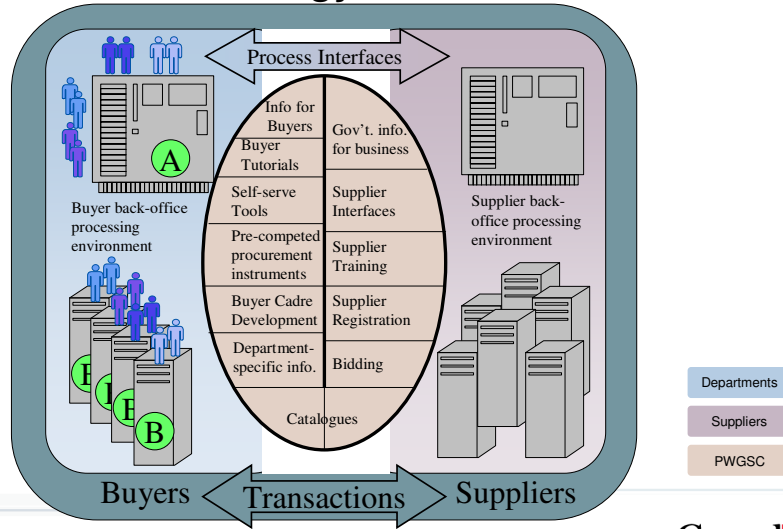
